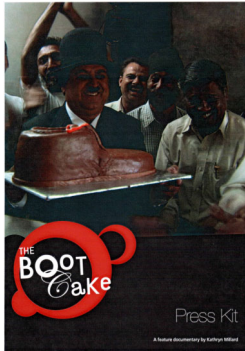

Filmmaker Kathryn Millard teaches Screenwriting and Production as well as Script Editing/Dramaturgy, Theories of Creativity, Performance, Color Theory, Photography, Media Psychology, & Visual Culture at Australia's Macquarie University. Her newest film *The Boot Cake*, about her quest to find the ghosts and reincarnations of Charlie Chaplin, will screen 3 times at this year's Chicago International Film Festival (Fri 10/17, Sat 10/18, & Tues 10/18). Kathryn's previous film credits include the critically acclaimed short feature *Parklands* starring Cate Blanchett.

WITASWAN ("wit-uh-swan") is an acronym for the Illinois-based initiative "Women in the Audience Supporting Women Artists Now."
